Community Advisory Panel Overview

Established in 1995, the ConocoPhillips San Francisco Refinery Community Advisory Panel (CAP) is an interactive forum between ConocoPhillips and the various communities surrounding the ConocoPhillips San Francisco Refinery and Carbon Plant. The CAP advises the company on issues of mutual interest and concern.

CAP members represent the diversity of the communities surrounding the ConocoPhillips refinery and are drawn from a cross-section of the community. Independent of ConocoPhillips, the CAP selects its own members, sets its own agenda, and is self-governing. New members are chosen by the CAP through an elective process in which prospective members initially complete an application followed by an interview with the CAP. Any issue or concern is open to discussion; however, safety and environmental issues tend to be the primary focus. These include concerns associated with refinery operations, emergency preparations, and response capabilities. Community outreach and involvement by ConocoPhillips is also a high priority.
